

Dear Members and Friends,

Ronald Heifetz and Marty Linsky were professors at the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard. In 2002, they published a book titled, *Leadership on the Line*. The last chapter of the book is *Sacred Heart*. That chapter fascinates me. They write,

...when you cover yourself up, you risk losing something as well. In the struggle to save yourself, you can give up too many of those qualities that are the essence of being alive, like innocence, curiosity, and compassion. To avoid getting hurt too badly, it is easy to turn innocence into cynicism, curiosity into arrogance, and compassion into callousness.

No one looks in the mirror and sees a cynical, arrogant, and callous self-image. We dress up these defenses, give them principled and virtuous names. Cynicism is called realism, arrogance masquerades as authoritative knowledge, and callousness becomes the thick skin of wisdom and experience.

To them, "sacred heart" is the ability to maintain innocence, curiosity, and compassion – an open heart – regardless of what is happening to you or around you. It is hard to do, but necessary to allow our experiences to have accurate meaning.

In April we will go with our Lord through His Passion. He experiences betrayal, denial, desertion, and death. His heart is exposed to us. We see that it is an open heart, a truly sacred heart. And in His Resurrection, we see again how He reaches out to us, with the words, gestures, and invitations that create life and community.

Turning cynicism into innocence, arrogance into curiosity, and callousness into compassion is part of the power of Christ at work in us. May His sacred heart give us the needed meaning to whatever is happening to us and around us.



Led by Mary Bongiovi. The class will discuss faith's psychology and the psychological faiths, what is faith and who has it, and the role of religion and spirituality in mental health.




## **IPC BOOK CLUBS**

This month, we report on ways that your donations to the Board of Deacons are helping hungry families in our area:

#### **CROP WALK PROCEEDS**

The Deacons are happy to report that some of the proceeds generated from the Crop Walk, which took place last Fall, were directed to the Dobbs Ferry Food Pantry, a local initiative & member of the Food Bank of Westchester.

This Food Pantry serves an average of 40 families, approximately 145 individuals (many young children and seniors).

The Deacons thank the congregation for their support and look forward our next Crop Walk in the Fall.

Together we can fight hunger both in our neighborhoods and the larger community!

#### RICE AND BEAN COLLECTION ON COMMUNION SUNDAYS

Do you know that there are about 250 hungry families who need our help getting food in our own community every month?

The Community Food Pantry of Sleepy Hollow and Tarrytown is a non-profit, all-volunteer, all donation organization which provides free monthly groceries to the hungry in Sleepy Hollow and Tarrytown. We at IPC have been collecting rice and dried beans for the past 6 years, which are then donated to the Food Pantry every month. However, we have seen a drop in our collection basket and it is time to pick up the pace to continue aiding this worthy cause!

Starting April, we will be bringing our collection to the Food Pantry on Communion Sundays. You will find the collection basket right by the entrance to the Sanctuary.

Please remember to regularly bring in rice (brown or white) and dried beans to church.
