# SUMMER CONSTRUCTION

#### **Good Shepherd Classrooms**

At the beginning of July, two Good Shepherd classrooms in the lower level of John Knox Hall flooded due to the heavy rains. As the room dried out, a layer of asbestos tiles, underneath the upper layer, became disturbed. After the abatement, new subfloors were constructed; new floor tiles laid; new exterior doors installed; walls painted; and new cabinets built and installed.

## **Playground**

New playground equipment for Good Shepherd was installed in both the upper and lower play areas. Many thanks to Keach Hagey Harris, who chaired the playground committee, and Good Shepherd Director, Mandy Landivinec, for steering this project. Next summer, additional grading of the pathway will take place, finishing the project.

## **Drainage**

Extensive new drainage was installed throughout the church property. New catch basins were installed in the front lawn, redirecting water away from the sanctuary, with larger drainage pipes installed by the ramp into the sanctuary. New catch basins and drainage pipes were installed in the back lawn. The entry way into the Good Shepherd classrooms on the lower level of John Knox were re-built, to prevent future flooding. A new awning now hangs over this area.

Many thanks to our contractors who expedited projects for us to have everything ready for the start of the school year—Ivkosic Painting, Karl Dibble, AVM Environmental, Those Guys, New Crystal Restorations, Hudson Landscapes, and Corsetti Contracting. Stay tuned for additional drainage projects this fall and fundraising efforts to help cover the costs of the projects.
