

†Learning Liturgy

The seven "O Antiphons" (also called the "Greater Antiphons" or "Major Antiphons") are prayers that are prayed in the days leading up to Christmas. Each Antiphon begins with "O" and addresses Jesus with a unique title which comes from the prophecies of Isaiah and Micah and whose initial letters, when read backwards, form an acrostic for the Latin "Ero Cras" which means "Tomorrow I come."

Those titles for Christ are:

Sapientia (Wisdom)

Adonai (Lord of Israel)

Radix Jesse (Root of Jesse)

Clavis David (Key of David)

 $\textbf{O}riens \ (Radiant \ Dawn/Dayspring/Morning \ Star)$

Rex Gentium (King of all nations/Gentiles)

Emmanuel (God with Us)
